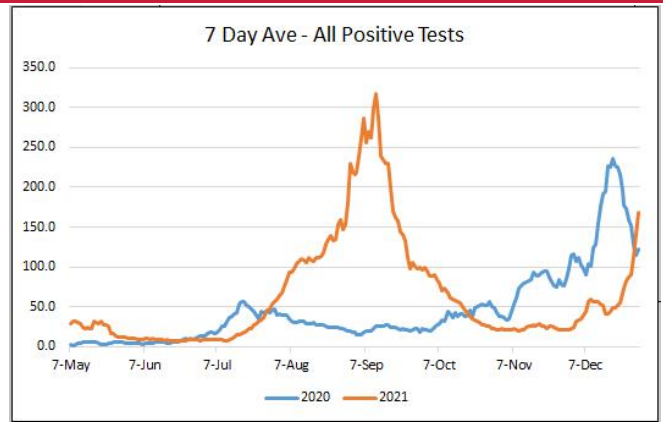

**ADDITIONAL INFORMATION**

- Perry Scanlan, "Numbers for 12/30/2021 reported as of 12/29/2021. Note that our last report was 12/21/2021. Since this period they reported 71 deaths in Montgomery Co. on 12/22/2021. I don't know why. Since then the numbers seem more accurate with 3, 1, 1, 2, 6, -2 (correction), and in today's report 5 deaths. This means we are averaging just under two deaths per day. This is significantly higher but perhaps the data is better now? Hospitalizations were 7 on 12/22/2021, then 0, 1, 0, 0, 2, 0, and 2 today(12/30). These still seem way undercounted. Active cases have risen from 615 to 1513 cases or 2.5x as many over the last week. The 7-day moving average confirmed positive cases grew from 36.3 to 87.4 as of today's 12/30 report. Overall, total case average grew from 66.6 to 168.0 which is about 2.5x higher on average. The percent positive test rates on confirmed tests are 23%, which is very high. We should all be very concerned about returning classes to normal.

- As of 1/3/22 there is no new data reported for Montgomery County since 12/30/21.
- Note about the charts, the data ranges on the graphs are May-April. Thus the blue 2020 line will become 2020-2021 and the orange line 2021-2022.
