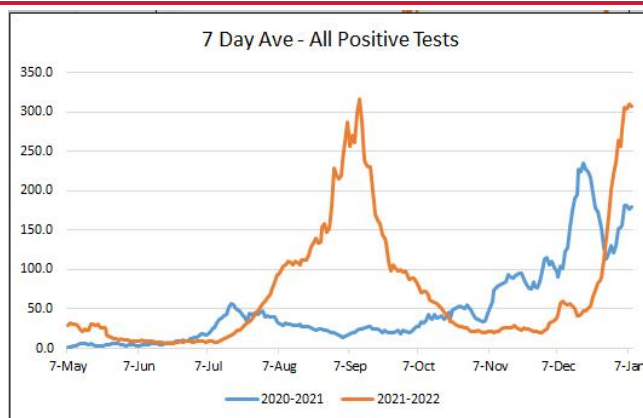

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

- Dr. Phillips, HR and Fisher discussed return to work testing. APSU doesn't require a negative test before returning to work. In fact, as you know, a person will continue to give a positive PCR result for up to 90 days. However, there are employees who have said they do not want to return to work until they test negative. The testing lab has rapid antigen tests if an employee is requesting one, but they must declare while in line that they want a **"return to work rapid test"**. They must also show no symptoms during testing or they will be sent home as a positive case. This will not begin until Monday 1/24/22.
