Self Reflection

In my thesis, I implemented my research by reading the history of Pygmalion, watching animated pieces based in Greco-Roman culture, and even going to Rome to study abroad. This is applied in history, story, and style of the final animation.

My ideas were expressed in a stylistically consistent and story-driven manner. The story is the strong backbone for the short animation. The expression of the content is stylistically similar to 2D animated stories that people my age can relate to. The original story of Pygmalion, and those that follow the same mold, depicts a hetero-normative relationship that strays into misogynistic themes.
