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INTRODUCTION

Reading skills are extremely important in a technological age. As technology becomes increasingly more sophisticated, so must reading skills. The individual's survival literally depends on his ability to read. He must read to drive an automobile, to get a job and keep it, to keep house, to shop, to live in this society. The level of literacy has been so raised that authorities now consider literate a person who can handle reading materials of a comparable difficulty to those ordinarily taught by the close of six years of school.

Unfortunately, because of large class size and unreadiness to read and learn, many children have not mastered the reading skills taught in the first six years of school by the time they reach the twelfth grade. This non-achievement necessitates having available corrective and remedial reading classes in the secondary schools. With a growing number of low-achieving pupils staying in school until high school graduation, teachers are now pressed to use more basic reading materials than ever before. Obviously, materials written for elementary students, particularly in the lower grades, are not suitable for students who are working, driving cars, dating and preparing themselves for adult life in the very near future. This selected bibliography was compiled to help secondary school teachers select materials that they might use in meeting the needs and interests of such students in improving their competency and enjoyment in reading. All of the material has been selected on the basis of appeal to the particular interests of the secondary school student. Information on the materials was obtained by the following methods: 1) actual use of the materials, 2) personal inspection of the material in question, 3) inspection of publishers' brochures. Where reading levels have been listed, they have been suggested by the publisher. The term "high interest-low vocabulary" is used to signify that the material is for use with students who are not able to read materials printed for the average student at junior-senior high school levels or above.

The bibliography is divided loosely into three sections. The materials listed in Section I include: 1) items related to general comprehension skills (identifying the main idea, reading for details, drawing conclusions, reading for inferences, etc.), 2) developmental lessons, which include not only comprehension skills but vocabulary and study skills exercises, 3) series of high interestlow vocabulary books. Section II includes only material related to improving word recognition and vocabulary skills. Section III lists materials related to study skills improvement (reading graphs, diagrams, maps, and tables; using reference materials, following directions) and a list of periodicals published for secondary school students who need easy reading materials on current issues. The information contained in this bibliography is current and includes materials with future publication dates.
