• A Place at Our Table Discussion Groups.

 Description: Austin Peay State University Interim President Dannelle Whiteside is partnering with APSU's Office of Equity, Access and Inclusion and the University's Diversity Committee for a new, campus-wide initiative, "A Place at Our Table."

Through this initiative, members of the campus community will meet in groups to discuss the nation's racial and social challenges. These group discussions will delve into the conscious and unconscious biases that affect how people may perceive the world, interact with others and envision the future.

The conversations will use books, articles, TED Talks, webinars, movies and other media to help guide participants to consider new perspectives, engage with colleagues and peers, admit their own vulnerabilities and accept responsibility for their thoughts and actions.

These groups of 5-6 people will engage in weekly, bi-weekly, monthly or quarterly discussions, depending on the group. Each meeting will be guided by an inclusion coach who will receive training from the Office of Equity, Access and Inclusion and members of the Diversity Committee.

These discussion groups are meant to provide different voices from across campus with a safe space to establish trust and respectfully engage in important and meaningful conversations. "A Place at Our Table" was developed to foster a diverse, affirming, and inclusive work and school environment. All campus members, including faculty, staff and students, are invited to be a part of a discussion group.
