

### **ADDITIONAL INFORMATION**

• Numbers for 12/14/2021 reported as of 12/12/2021. Current information suggests that Omicron may be slightly milder in symptoms, morbidity, and mortality. Unfortunately, it seems to spread at a much greater rate than Delta. It is now in 30 states including Tennessee. Compounding these issues are people not testing as often or are using very unreliable rapid tests, which will cause underreporting of the number of cases in Montgomery County. This is the 'Iceberg' effect.
