## TIME

has been important to the growth of Austin Peay State College.

Created as a Junior College by the Act of the General Assembly in 1927, Austin Peay Normal School was named in honor of Governor Austin Peay. With J. S. Ziegler as president, the school opened its doors to higher learning September 23, 1929.

A short TIME later, in the Fall of 1930, Dr. Philander P. Claxton, former United States Commissioner of Education, began his term of office. Dr. Claxton spent sixteen years as president during which TIME Austin Peay became a four year college and in 1943, the name was changed to Austin Peay State College.


After Dr. Claxton's retirement in July, 1946, Halbert Harvill assumed the position of college president. During his administration which ended in 1962, the college made great strides in size and education advancement. It was during this TIME that Austin Peay broadened its educational horizon by adding the Master's Degree to the list of degrees given.

Following President Harvill's retirement, Earl E. Sexton served as acting president of the college until January, 1963. At this TIME State Commissioner of Education, Joe Morgan assumed the presidency of the college.



#### DEAN TOM K. SAVAGE



Each year the honor of Governor is bestowed upon a Senior on the basis of leadership, scholarship, and service to the college. He is chosen by the entire student body.







The award, a bronze plaque, has highly deserved honor. It is given on the basis of character, leadership and service to the college.



The 1962 gridiron season at Austin Peay State College was one which saw the Governors finish with their worst season in history, losing 10 games without a victory.

Coach Art Van Tone's squad, loaded with freshmen and sophomores, was handicapped tremendously by lack of experience, as only seven seniors returned to balance the inexperience.

Looking at the brighter side of the year, the Governors smashed 18 school records. Richard Moore, senior quarterback, headed the list of record breakers by personally setting 11 school marks. Moore, during his four-year career completed 105 of 262 passes for 1359 yards and 16 touchdowns. He had 26 aerials intercepted, and his completion percentage during the 1959-62 period was .401. Last season, Moore topped the total offense department with 528 yards, and headed the passers with an even 600 yards.

Other record-setting individuals included senior quarterback Cobb Parker and freshman halfback Tim Chilcutt. Parker who punted 36 times last season, ran his career total to 138.

Chilcutt eclipsed three school marks by returning 18 kickoffs for 325 yards. He also returned 17 punts for a new school mark.

The Govs as a team became the passingest club in history by attempting 217 passes and completing 83. The Govs established still another record by punting 71 times while returning 23, to tie the 1959 mark.

In the rushing department, All-VSAC fullback Tommy Donnelly led with 145 yards while freshman Eddie Gray followed with 117. Adding to his kickoff and punt records, Chilcutt topped four departments with pass receiving and interceptions. Senior end Rupert Baker led the scorers with 18 points, and sophomore Sammy Flatt led the punting corps with a 36.6 average.

Coach Art Van Tone, after completing the 1962 season,

resigned as head coach but will continue his duties as associate professor of Health and Physical Education until May 31.

Each year APSC has placed its football athletes on the All-VSAC squad. The 1962 football team was no exception since it had three members of the squad to make the All-VSAC team. Included were: Claude Clements, end; Tommy Donnelly, fullback; and Rocky Cobb, guard. Richard Moore also won a position of honor with his attainment of the Williamson Little All-American title.

Although the Govs found the going tough during the 1962 season, the future seasons point to even tougher times since the Govs will officially enter the Ohio Valley Conference competition in 1963. Newly appointed coach, Bill Dupes, will certainly have his work cut out for him in the coming seasons.





The sports staff of the FAREWELL AND HAIL wishes to spotlight David B. Aaron, a man whose career as coach and director of athletics of Austin Peay State College has brought to him, as well as to ASPC, a highly respected reputation and record in the field of athletics.

Aaron came to APSC in 1946, and during his sixteen year tenure as head basketball coach, his teams set a remarkable won-lost record of 258-174 for a .597 percentage.

Aaron's brilliant career includes a 143-53 home record for an excellent .729 percentage; four VSAC crowns based on tournament play; six straight VSAC regular season championships; one NCAA South Region Championship; three trips to the NCAA Regional Playoffs; and four trips to the NAIA District Playoffs. Other than basketball, Aaron has coached nearly all the sports at APSC during various periods of time since 1946. In 1948 he led the footballers to the VSAC crown, and guided the golfers to two conference championships in a three year span.

Aaron has discontinued all coaching duties and is now devoting more time to his duties as Director of Athletics.

Let us point out that Aaron's combined coaching record of 321-227-6 is one of excellent standing which will probably go down in the annals of APSC athletics as the "Aaron Era".

## 1962-63 Basketball

The 1962-63 basketball year saw Austin Peay State College playing one of its toughest schedules in history. First-year coach George Fisher took over the helm from Dave Aaron who retired as head coach after 16 years of excellent tutorship. Aaron, in his tenure as head mentor, led the Governors to six consecutive Volunteer State Athletic Conference championships, and Fisher, in his debut as coach, captured the seventh crown in guiding his basketballers to a 9-1 conference record.

During the course of the season, Fisher relied heavily upon co-captains Doug Stamper and Henny Murrey, along with Steve Miller, and sophomores Jim DeForest, Seldon Sledd, and Richard Keller. These players were supported capably by seniors Jim Sugg, Jackie Winders, John Briggeman, and Bobby Winders. Fisher had such depth and balance that he

was able to use many different player combinations, which resulted in a tremendous 18-9 overall mark.

Stiff competition was provided by such top-notch teams as Southern Illinois University, Pan-American College, Arkansas State, and two future Ohio Valley Conference opponents—Middle Tennessee State College and East Tennessee State College. Pan-American came into the friendly confines of Memorial Gymnasium as one of the top-ranked small college teams in the nation, and the Govs won by a 60-56 count. Another small college power, SIU, was also handled by the hosting Governors 85-71, but in the return match at Carbon-dale, Ill., the Salukis defeated visiting APSC. The two games with Arkansas were outstanding in that both contests required overtime, with the Governors being victorious at Jonesboro, Ark., 75-71, and the Indians defeating the Govs in double overtime at Memorial Gym, 101-94.

The annual "Torch Game" between APSC and David Lipscomb College which had been played since 1957, was one of the highlights of past cage seasons. This year, it was terminated since the event had not been achieving its true purpose. Also, due to APSC's entrance into the OVC, the Bisons are not included in the 1963-64 schedule.






On two occasions this past season, the Govs scored over 100 points as they posted a 103-76 decision over Belmont, and completely swamped Bethel, 114-52. The latter contest was one which saw APSC breaking four Memorial Gymnasium records and tying one. Included in the record-shattering parade were: most points scored by APSC in a single game (114); most field goals scored (50); most decisive victory (62 points). The best field goal percentage was broken by Kentucky Wesleyan with its 57.6 average. The combined total of most rebounds made was tied by the APSC-Bethel match with a 123 total which matched the APSC-SIU mark set in 1958-59.

Based on a 27-game season, statistics reveal that Doug Stamper led all scorers with 505 points for an 18.7 average. The junior playmaker from Hamilton, Ohio, was named to



the All-VSAC squad for regular season play. Stamper was also honored by being selected as the Most Valuable Player in the Western Division of the VSAC. Another brilliant Gov performer was Steve Miller, who scored 350 points for a 12.9 average. Miller also led the team in three departments —field goal percentage (.539); free throw percentage (.754), and also snared 233 rebounds for an 8.6 average. Jim DeForest, sophomore transfer from Eastern Kentucky, who did not become eligible until Jan. 1, was a tremendous asset during the latter half of the campaign. Playing in all 21 games after attaining eligibility, DeForest racked up 243 points and had the third best average (11.6). He also picked off 16 rebounds for a 7.8 average. In the annual Volunteer State Athletic Conference tourna-



These victories moved Austin Peay State into the finals against Carson-Newman—the defending tournament champs. The Eagles used a deliberate stall offense and completely stymied APSC hopes for a fifth tourney championship. Stamper scored 16 points, but it was not enough to subdue a 48-39 Eagle victory. The Governors, in their last VSAC competition, placed Stamper, Steve Miller and Jim DeForest on the all-tournament squad.

For the fourth time Austin Peay State College was extended an invitation to compete in the small college NCAA playoffs. The Governors accepted the invitation to participate in the NCAA South Central Regional playoffs at Louisville, Ky., March 8-9.


# 1962-63 Freshman Basketball

## 1962 Golf Squad—VSAC Champions

The 1962 APSC golfers captured the Volunteer State Athletic Conference golf championship for the second consecutive year, and have compiled an impressive 15-6 overall match record during the past two years.

Coach George Fisher completed his third year as head coach in which his teams won two Volunteer State Athletic Conference championships.

An impressive seasonal mark was not the 1962 Governors' fortune with an overall record of 1-5. However, they completely outclassed opponents in a tri-meet with David Lipscomb and U-T Martin.

The '62 edition was hurt by the loss of their top three scorers from 1961; Tom Phillips, Charles Reinhart and John Flatt. Gone too, were four of the next six top men, leaving only Blakey Bradley who continued his fine showing in his specialties, the hurdles and high jump. Nick Nichols', a fine quartemiler, 1962 output was cut by a knee operation.

The bright spot of the 1962 season was Ronny Page, freshman dash sensation, who set a school record in the 100 yard dash with a time of :09.8 seconds, breaking the old mark of :09.9 set by Bill Alexander in 1956. Tom Hinkle broke Don McKennon's record set in 1961 of 10:32.8 in the two mile with a time of 10:28.

Other top performers included weightman Ed Fredette, Cobb Parker, school record holder in the javelin, and Bob Binder, high jumper.

Austin Peay State, defending VSAC champions, was dethroned by Union University who scored 71 points with the Governors finishing a slow third, 39 points, behind Carson-Newman's 43.

The pep club, known as the "Blazing Staters", concluded its second year of supporting the cheerleaders and APSC athletics.









## Kappa Delta Pi




