## Harvill Offers College For Atomic Tests

### Charles M. Waters Commits Suicide In Frantic Effort To Escape

Charles M. Waters, a former sponsor of Austin Peay's leading collegiate publication, was found this morning hanging from a fluorescent light in the ALL STATE office located in Stewart 12.

He was discovered by the editor and associate editor, Lynn Cady and Barbara Darnell, who had come to tell him that the ALL STATE was coming out on schedule for the first time this year. They immediately called the police who conducted an extensive investigation. Dr. Edward P. Cutler, college physician, diagnosed the case as death by strangulation with complications. The coroner's verdict was suicide.

The unusual implement of strangulation was a rope plaited from strips of old ALL STATES. The rope was a magnificent example of art work of the Baroque period, and will be kept on display by the art departments. Mrs. Waters, the deceased's wife, told the reporters, "Art was always my husband's favorite hobby." Waters apparently stood on a stack of old materials to reach the light, which is quite high from the floor.

A suicide note was found in the dead man's left shoe. It is here reprinted for the interest of the student body:

"I cannot stand it any longer. I have come to the end of my rope. (No pun intended.) Life has become unbearable since my freshman English class has begun writing intelligible themes and my journalism class is making all 'A's'. There is nothing left for me but this.

### FBI Finally Solves Million Dollar Theft; Putnam Confesses

FBI agents, assisted by local police, closed in on the leader of the mob that committed the famous million dollar "Brinks" hold-up in Boston two years ago.

The elusive criminal, Robert "Red" Putnam, who gave federal and state law enforcement agencies a two year chase that extended from Labrador to Chile, was finally traced to his hideout in Robb Hall.

In a fearful confession, Putnam told of the fearful years of dodging police, and of his vain efforts to enjoy the fruits of his crime. "In the end," he confessed, "it all went for the bare essentials of survival. You see, I had to eat at the cafeteria, so now, all I have to show for it all is thirty-five cents and bitter memories of nights of terror at Robb Hall."

Mrs. Bertha Cayce, dietitian in charge of the cafeteria revealed when questioned, "I always suspected that the boy was not completely honest. I often wondered where he got the money to have two bottles of milk with his lunch every day."

In an effort to "square myself with the world," Putnam told details of the robbery and of his efforts to escape over the years. "Witnesses said that we wore suits or hats and pea-coats, and grotesque rubber masks. That bit about the masks is a dirty lie."

"After we pulled the job, we fled to Tijuana where we spent the dough equally. I, as leader of the mob, got \$699,330."

During questioning at the Clarksville jail, Putnam revealed that he came to Austin Peay State College because he thought it the ideal hideout.

The cops knew they were dealing with a smart criminal, and the last place they would look for a main hideout be the campus of Austin Peay.

WASHINGTON, D. ### Entrance Requirement Revised At APSC

Austin Peay State College, in keeping with the old tradition of "grow with AP," has issued new entrance requirements for incoming freshmen.

As for I.Q. rating, the prospective student must have at least a 3.50 untemper rating and be able to spell such difficult words as YES and NO especially YES. As one might easily judge, the faculty is putting a big emphasis on the intelligence quota of its incoming students this year.
