

### **ADDITIONAL INFORMATION**

Numbers for 2/17/2022 reported through 2/10/2022. Cases are declining from the peak one about a week or two ago. The percent positive tests are near the previous peak highs in September which supports the idea that PCR testing is declining as a large number of people were infected. Less PCR testing will occur for the next few months as individuals that tested positive would not be PCR tested but rather antigen tested. If they become symptomatic in the 90-day window there is a possibility of infection with a second variant and they should get antigen testing. There have been 11 deaths for two straight reports in the county over the last 7 days.
