Winning basketball teams are a tradition at Austin Peay, and this year's edition was no exception. During the regular season, Coach Dave Aaron's basketball aces were undefeated in college competition with a record of sixteen consecutive wins. They conquered the strong Knights of Columbus team of Nashville for a season record of seventeen wins against four defeats, having suffered two of those at the hands of Square Deal, a Semi-Pro Club from Nashville. The Governors bowed to the House of David in a one-point thriller, and again to the Camp Campbell Aggregation in the latter part of the season. Each of the following teams stood two defeats by the high scoring Governors: Martin College, Union University of Jackson, Lambuth, Middle Tennessee State, Cumberland, Bethel, University of Tennessee Junior College, and David Lipscomb.

Go, "Hos," Go!

The first Tennessee Intercollegiate Conference Basketball Tournament was held at Lebanon, Cumberland University being the host school. On their return trip, the Governors brought with them the runners-up trophy. Via wins over Bethel 86 to 66 and Middle Tennessee State 64 to 46, they reached the finals. There, the Governors were beaten by the uncanny accuracy of the Eagles of Tennessee Tech. Rating the All-Tournament Team were Guard George Fisher and Center James Stone. The Nashville Banner's All-State Team included Stone and Captain Paul Aaron. Thus ended the 1947 basketball season for Austin Peay, a year in which the Governors enjoyed a record of success even though they didn't win the payoff, the TIBT championship.

Returning to the campus after an absence during the war-time years were only two basketball lettermen, Ed Rutledge and Paul Aaron. The former graduated at the end of the spring quarter and consequently did not participate in the tournament. George Fisher, Tony Hostettler, Jack Butler, James Stone, Richard Hardwick, Louis Catignani, Henry Farmer, Charlie Gentry, and Carlton Stephens, all of whom were World War II veterans, completed the squad.

"Going Up."

Indicative of the Governor's offensive punch is the fact that three men bettered the 200-point mark. James Stone, tallies for an average of 19 per game. George Fisher hit the bucket for 228 points, while Tony Hostettler chalked up 221. Following close on Hostettler's heels was Paul Aaron with 190. Continuing the scoring parade was Butler with 149, Catignani 57, Hardwick 30, Rutledge 25, Morton 16, Stephens 14, and Gentry 1. Morton left the squad early in the season. At the grand finale the Austin Peay Quintet had amassed a total of 1,254 points for an average of 59.52 per game while limiting the opposition to 965 points or an average per game of 45.95.

Plans were made during the 1946-47 school year for the formation of the Tennessee Intercollegiate Athletic Conference. Eligible for membership was every four-year institution in the state, with the exceptions of the University of Tennessee and Vanderbilt. A forerunner of the Conference was the basketball tournament held at Lebanon in which Austin Peay was the runner-up.

On completing this successful season representing Austin Peay, the rampaging Governors entered the tournament of the Independent-Basketball Association of America held in Nashville. They came out on top in this one by defeating Budweiser of Nashville in the finals 44-41, thereby qualifying for the National Tourney held in Springfield, Missouri, to determine the Independent Championship of the United States. However, they were unable to enter because some of the players were engaged in spring football practice. In the IBA Tourney, the Governors avenged the two earlier defeats by the powerful Square Dealers by trouncing them in the semi-finals 51-40. They reached the semi-finals by wins over Inglewood and Wrights Photo, two of Nashville's better independent teams.

Of infinite value to the teams, basketball and football, was an energetic, effervescent, untiring cheering squad, captained by the irrepressible Jesse Troutt, who was ably assisted by Trez Thompson and the pulchritudinous Misses, Mary Wilson, Christine Price, and Ann Roberts.

At the time of publication the sports banquet had not taken place. It was at this event that the 1947-48 football and basketball captains were to be elected.
