## FACULTY SENATE MINUTES

## February 9, 1984

Members absent were: James Bell, Opal Canarina, Beck McMahan, Wayne Whitmer, Tommy Meadows.

- 1. The meeting was called to order at 3:17 by Chairman Billy Thompson.
- 2. Don Der moved the adoption of the minutes of the January meeting. Second by Robert Sears, motion carried.
- 3. A motion to adopt the Agenda was made by Don Der. Second by Ramon Magrans, motion carried.
- 4. Dr. Riggs reported on:
  - A. Across-the-board raise history
    - 1. Surplus funds held by state institutions were ordered to be spent.
    - Monies set aside for APSU was reduced from 5% to
       2% resulting in no surplus funds for the university.
    - 3. According to Dr. Nix, impounded funds were to be used for
      - a. inequity adjustments
      - b. merit pay
      - c. market adjustment pay
      - d. employee reclassification
      - e. new positions

It was later learned that other state institutions used monies for across-the-board raises. However, the administration feels that monies were spent to their best advantage at APSU.

- B. Inequity of pay compared with other state universities
  - 1. Results from formula scales based on regional peer universities.
  - 2. Results from the administrative philosophy of using salary money to expand academic programs and supportive faculty.
- 5. Dil Bhatia moved to amend the agenda by postponing items five through seven. Second by Vernon Warren, motion carried.

- 6. In a brainstorming session the Senate and guests discussed methods of increasing faculty salaries which included:
  - A. Lobbying legislators
  - B. Lobbying THEC
  - C. Lobbying Board of Regents
  - D. Reappropriating existing funds
- 7. Ellen Weed moved that an ad-hoc committee be named to research possible actions that the Senate could take to increase faculty salaries and report to the Senate in a special session on February 23. Second by C. T. Mattox, motion carried.

  - B. That the following examination schedule be established.
