- 8. Motion that the Faculty Senate will not have regular monthly meetings during the summer.
- 9. University Calandar. Helen Heitgerd, APSU/TEA President, reported on an APSU/TEA study of faculty opinion regarding the university calendar. She noted that in a survey faculty respondents agreed that spring break should include five teaching days and two weekends (58 yes vs. 5 no) and that quarters should be of equal length (54 yes vs. 5 no). President Heitgerd recommended a faculty committee to work on the calendar.

The Minority Report makes the recommendation that in lieu of other registration duties, faculty members from the main campus and competent to give general baccalaureate advisements should be assigned for advising duties at Fort Campbell Center during the week of registration.
