

#### ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

• Numbers for 1/13/2022 reported as of 1/8/2022. Due to reporting changes some of the categories have to change. Hospitalizations and deaths are still grossly underreported based on conflicts between community data and reported data. Active cases are listed with the % change since last reported. The positive daily cases are now 7-day averages with the net change in average since the last report. The graph will show long-term trend. We are 10 average cases short of the all-time high in September. In short, this is approaching the highest risk for COVID-19 for the campus community of any time during the pandemic. Given the lack of reporting of many cases, it is likely that we are already setting new highs. As classes reconvene, we should expect large amount of absences from faculty, staff, and students as we start the semester. Also, it should be noted that the county data reported is already 5 days behind and only is reported 1 time per week which means actionable data is greatly lagging.
