Call to order – Senate President Elaine Berg

Remarks

- 1. Senate President Elaine Berg
 - D2L upgrade scheduled for some time during Winter Break has been rescheduled for the end of May 2013 (Memorial Day weekend)
 - Wintermester length has been changed to 6 weeks
 - Provost Denley and Senate President Berg have discussed the use of D2L system for e-dossiers
 - Need to determine if we need to stay with this system or move to another system that would work better for e-dossiers
 - Provost Denley and Senate President Berg agreed that faculty committee needs to look at this issue
 - Senate President Berg is asking the Faculty Red Committee to take on this task
 - Senator Wadia and Mitzie Thompson have agreed to be resource people for this committee
 - Issue needs to be examined from standpoint of both faculty members creating an e-dossier and those reviewing the e-dossier
 - QEP (Quality Enhancement Plan) Committee has met
 - Charged with identifying what our QEP will focus upon
 - Time provided at end of meeting for questions of Dr. Griffy
 - Faculty/Staff Appreciation Day that was scheduled for Saturday, November 3rd has been moved to Saturday, November 17th, and the time of tailgate has been moved to 9 a.m.-11 a.m. because football game starts at 11 a.m.
- 2. University President –Tim Hall
 - Presented information on funding situation
 - In November THEC will make recommendations for funding
 - Passing out funding numbers now to make certain everyone is clear with judging their funding numbers
 - Points are awarded for certain types of results such as students progression from one school year to the next to graduation

- Funding (UT & TBR schools) results ranged from decrease of 2.4% to increase of 6.5%
- o APSU funding results were an increase of 6.5%
- APSU experienced a significant increase in the number of graduates

Capital projects

- o Trahern should reach initial stage on list for authorization this summer
- Governor Haslam's new policy is to have 25% of cost from the institution for capital project
- This will be 5 to 6 million dollars for the Trahern project
- This money is typically the cost of the design for the project-we have the needed funds for this project
- Has been suggested that we may be better off building new building and just refreshing Trahern rather than renovating
- Costs of new addition will be more than renovations
- o Priority is achieving better class space
- If new structure is built it will probably be in Trahern parking lot or MMC parking lot
- Library is on a list but not on one that is a priority for funding
- THEC requires TBR to have list of what might be built
- New projects get on list as the funded projects are completed and are removed from list
- o TBR gives a higher score to projects that increase classroom space
- This is why library is down on list
- o Getting new library is less likely since it is not favored in scoring
- New classroom building would probably be funded immediately (within 2 year period)
- With Governor Haslam's funding policy we will need to put substantial funds into each project
- Increased enrollment is how we obtain money through the extra tuition
- This extra money is put aside each year, if enrollment is not sufficient then money will not be available
- Governor Haslam has suggested universities might get funds for their part of new project funding through private donors
- May be detrimental because donors typically give money for scholarships or building, but wouldn't not give money for both
- Their giving to facilities will probably take money away from student scholarships

Questions from senators

- o Do we know if current downturn with enrollment is due to deployments
- May be part of it, but not the whole answer
- Downturn for us was about 2.6% with the entire TBR institutions being approximately 3%
- The 2.6% decrease was approximately 200 students-we are still waiting on Fort Campbell's Fall II numbers
- Expression of gratitude for President Hall working to get us the equity adjustment in salaries
- Would library building funds be more likely if we included class space
- Library has a different structure
- Space design is more for students who are working on group projects
- This does not necessarily mean less space

 If we considered building project we would certainly look at more classroom space in library

3. Provost – Tristan Denley

- Commented on some other thoughts concerning library improvements
 - Main floor of library looks different than years before
 - Beginning to take on new look
 - o 93,000 students came to library in September
 - o Do not see the role of library diminishing but changing
 - o Air conditioning in library is going to be overhauled
 - Meeting last week to discuss the length of project
- Downturn in enrollment was not uniform across all student categories
 - Highest increase in enrollment was students scoring 26 and above on ACT, accounted for 25%
 - o HOPE scholarship supported for 1300 students
 - AP Day substantially increases likelihood of student coming to Austin Peay when attending event
 - Want to make AP Day a spectacular event with awarding a \$500 prize to the department and student organization that has the best table display
 - o Campus tours play an important role in students deciding to attend APSU
 - o Encouraging Admissions to partner with departments for student visits
 - Major selling point to have the student tour the facilities in the department of interest
 - Need to maximize the opportunity to show them the department's offerings
 - Paying special attention to these things should result in enrollments we experienced before
 - Appears to be evidence that the fewer students seen now are because of downturns in the birthrates 18 years ago
- Questions from senators
 - What is the outlook for our special money sources
 - Summer money is secure
 - o Hope students bring in more funding, not Pell grant students
 - This is opposite of what has been seen in past
- Spring 2013 schedule
 - o It should be coming out soon
 - o The timing is about what it has been and when it should be available
- Asked to explain why the preregistration schedule is during Veteran's Holiday and Thanksgiving Holiday
 - Preregistration sequence is organized by TBR so our schedule is determined by them so that is why it is when it is
- 4. Vice-President Chad Brooks
 - Introduced the three new faculty senate members
 - Susan Cockrell filling unexpired seat in Business
 - o Brian Hock filling open seat in Social Sciences
 - Tracy Nichols filling unexpired seat in Humanities
- 5. Dr. Lowell G. Roddy, Director of Student Counseling Services
 - Talked about what the center does with students.

- Mental health and academics go hand in hand
- Five counselors have not been able to keep up with the workload
- Talk about relationship breakups and jobs
- Presented with the woes of students and complaints of not getting work completed
- Along with academic responsibilities they have jobs and too many balls to juggle
- Presented the percentages of mental health issues seen in the center
- Presented the percentages of various health issues experienced by the students seen in the center
- Provided information on some of the special issues experienced by students
 - These include such things as homesickness, suicide ideations and attempts, and sexual abuse
- Presented problems that are seen with drug and alcohol abuse
- Office of Student Counseling Services has seen 30 to 60% more student this year as compared to earlier years with more intense issues
- Indications of when to refer students
 - They state they have a problem
 - Observe students with flat affect
 - Suddenly do poorly in class
 - Asks for help and you are not certain what to do
 - o Zones out or demonstrates panic
- How to refer a student
 - Talk to student to let them know you are concerned and that they may need to talk with counselor
 - o Discuss service options
 - o Assist student with making contact with center
- Questions from faculty
 - Statement that it had been noticed that students seem to be caring for elderly family members and putting off other responsibilities to take care of them
 - It was reported that Counseling Services see some students like this, but not as many as you might expect
- 6. Reports from Faculty Senate Representatives
- Dean's Council Senator Mercy Cannon
 - Performance evaluations
 - HR is moving forms to People Administration (online)
 - This year our performance funding score was 92 points out of 100
 - Three years ago we were at 83 out of 100
 - Program review (ensures quality and standards) and major fields tests scores are part of this funding score
 - Each point is worth \$10,000
 - Also included in the score-making progress toward DFW rates in gateway courses, and some kind of survey of students (NSSE), alumni, and employers (this year), etc.
 - Grants and Sponsored Research
 - In spring, invited U. S. Attorney General's grant fraud agency to speak on issues such as purchase of gift cards with grant money
 - o 3 TBR schools under FBI investigation for grant fraud

- Currently at 2.6 million dollars in grants, about 800,000 short from last year attributable to High School Upward Bound
- Working to create equity among graduate coordinator duties and compensation
- Enrollment Management
 - 326 students registered for November AP Day
 - Last year 340 attended
 - o 4270 Academic Alerts were issued equals 2674 students were alerted
 - Only 1.5 people in this office reaching out to these students
 - Asking for help from Student Support Services to reach students
 - o Asking faculty (advisors, APSU instructors, mentors, etc.) to help as well
 - Email going out about new "note" section in advising page
 - Whatever is entered is visible to the students and to anyone else who as access to the site
 - Provost Denley is putting together reviewing committees for transfer pathways
 - Asking for faculty involvement on these committees
- Questions from senators
 - What were those universities being investigated for
 - Grant fraud
 - No specific information of what the fraud entails
- Academic Council Vice-President Brooks
 - Core change to go before TBR approval
 - HIST 1210 and 1220 will move from Social and Behavioral Sciences core to History Core to go in competition with HIST 2010 and HIST 2020
 - Sociology underwent considerable changes with one being a change in numbering from SOC 2010 to SOC 1010
 - Several areas changed with a change in requirement number to 36 hours
 - Changes were unanimously approved
 - TBR approved the Master's in Science and Technology
 - Computer Science will have additional course, but major does not change
 - RODP nursing program will require a statistics course
 - Questions from senators
 - When will History change-not certain
- TBR Faculty Sub-council Dr. David Kanervo
 - Comments made by Chancellor Morgan
 - Governor Haslam continuing to explore efforts to decide what his higher education agenda will be-he wants to make capital outlays
 - Need to find a permanent leader in Vice Chancellor for Academic Affairs
 - Paula Short vacated this position since then a search has been going on for this position
 - Questioned if position requires a terminal degree
 - Adopted a resolution wanting an earned doctorate in an academic area for Vice Chancellor

- Dr. Kanervo voted no-he explained that he felt this had something to do with limiting candidates who have a JD
- Established a task force to head up an examination of where system should go in next 10 years
- o Also create a task force for Academic freedom/shared governance
- President Hall recommended as a member on this working group because of his openness for shared governance with us

Action items

- Limited English proficiency
 - Under Title VI (Civil Rights Act of 1964) all institutions must have a process
 - Campus may use identification cards or posters to determine persons of language
 - Provide information on staff interpreters
 - Will need to provide an outside interpreter when in-house person is not available
 - Dealing more with non-faculty and non-students visiting campus
- Common calendar
 - Intended to go into effect fall of 2014
 - Needs to be approved by Student Affairs and President's sub-council
 - Institutions need to determine if the 2 days will be used for fall break in October or if Monday and Tuesday during Thanksgiving
 - Wednesday will be a part of the Thanksgiving Holiday
 - As a university at some point we will have to decide what way we want to go
 - RODP will follow the community college calendar
 - Some faculty members may not have a fall break if teaching RODP classes and our breaks differ with the community college calendar
 - Passed

Discussion items

- Sick leave bank policy
 - Sick leave bank cannot be used for taking care of an ill family member
 - Can use personal sick leave to take care of family members, but cannot use sick leave bank
 - This is according to law
 - Recommended that we look into the need for change in law
- Issues with temporary appointments
 - Can a temporary contract appointment be ended with 30 days notice
 - At this time it appears to be legal under current policy
 - Need to see where faculty stands
- UT Faculty Senate Resolution supporting benefits for same-sex couples
 - UT Chancellor turned the request down
 - Seeking a resolution from each of the faculty senates throughout the state to support them
 - Need to see where faculty stands on this issue
- Arrest of Faculty Senate President at TSU
 - Decision was made to not take any action
 - Question about whether individual faculty senates might want to take action
- Information items

- Update on GPA concerning junior college transfers
 - Policy passed in which transfers' GPAs will not follow them when they transfer
 - Transfers will begin with a zero GPA when they come to us
 - Will come into effect summer of 2014
- Questions from senators
 - Has it ever been discussed about possibly ending fall classes before Thanksgiving
 - Once we come back from Thanksgiving we only have between 1 to 2 weeks left and the students are not very motivated
 - Not a discussion of ending the semester before Thanksgiving by sub-council
 - Some supposition that at least one week of classes must be held after Thanksgiving to allow for academic review before final exams
 - Motion made, seconded and passed to extend the discussion period
 - Question regarding the request to support UT proposal for same-sex benefits and how we proceed with that
 - o Dr. Kanervo read the request for support
 - Wanted to know if there is a time issue
 - Did not know if there is, but felt since it has been turned down once, would like to have it at the end of this year
 - Faculty Senate President requested that the Executive Committee discuss this and bring it back to the November meeting
 - No objections for the Executive Committee to proceed

Old Business

- Update on Foreign Language Resolution Senator Tim Winters -- Information Item
 - o A proposal was presented to the General Education Committee
 - o Requested to add a foreign language option to the Communication core
 - Council appeared to be positive about the proposal
 - Some discussion about possibly adding it to the Humanities core
 - o Proposal cannot be sent through at this time
 - Will be working with the appropriate dean to submit in January
 - Need to determine if it will be placed as an inclusion or an option
 - Possibly an option in lieu of speech
 - Merely trying to reinstate the previous program of having it as part of the core before it was removed when we changed to the 120 hour policy for graduation
- Questions from faculty
 - Wanted to know if it was going to be a one semester course
 - Indicated that the language faculty would like it to be both 1010 and 1020, but the recognize the problem with the number of hours
 - o There are still a couple of items that they are working on

New Business

- Student Course Grade Appeal Policy (3:033) Senator Mickey Wadia -- Information Item
 - Discussed faculty input on revisions for Policy 3:003
 - Policy was revised 4 years ago
 - Multiple committees are trying to work this out
 - There is no basic problem with this policy

- The issue lies with the formal grade appeal and the short semesters schedule creating some issues with appealing within the deadline
- Presently only 1 appeal has been declared
- o Indicated that policy should not be revised if only one problem has occurred
- Encountered problem last summer with 1 student processing a formal grievance with requesting to have a grade change
- Because of the nature of summer being a shorter timeframe than a long semester questions arose concerning the process of review since faculty are not on campus
- Issue is that agreement must be decided if problem occurs in summer session the appeal must be handled in the fall
- Problem we are faced with is that if faculty has left after completing the summer session and a student wants to appeal their grade
- The committee handling this matter has been told that they need to consult with our attorney for her recommendations and approval as a safeguard
- o For an appeal in spring II the earliest day to appeal should be beginning of fall I
- Indicated that telling the faculty they have to be available when off contract may not be possible since they are technically not under contract
- The process of appealing and deadline dates may have potential problems for adjuncts, temporary faculty, and graduate assistants who teach
- Need to consider the policy language of who would serve as substitute in these special circumstances
- No language is currently included in the policy
