The seniors on the '52 squad were: Bobby Ladd, Jim Odum, Charles Quarles, Carlton Balthrop and Harris Binkley.


Austin Peay played two V.S.A.C. games: tied one—won one. M.T.S.C. played only one—won it.



Big men for the Govs were Ladd, Trenton, Brown, Ramsey, Gann and Mitchell.


## VICTORY FOR A.P.







### GOVERNORS TROUNCE DELTA STATE





Grace Fore is a two-year member of the rooting team, a physical education major, and hails from Woodlawn, Tennessee.


