- 1. Senate President Elaine Berg
 - Last meeting for 2012-13 academic year
 - Announced that Pamela Allen, Administrative Assistant for the Department of History and Philosophy, was the winner of the Faculty Senate Staff Award
 - Dr. Bert Randall presented roses to Pamela Allen
 - Dr. Browder expressed his appreciation for her work in the department
 - President Berg expressed thanks to all senators present, new, and those leaving
 - Presented what is expected from those who serve as senators
 - Presented the new senators for 2013-2014, review Faculty Senate Webpage under Document Review section
 - Discuss the accomplishments that the Faculty Senate Executive Committee had performed over the year
 - Presented the Executive Committee with awards
 - Expressed thanks to President Hall and Provost Denley for their leadership of the University
 - Thanks was also given to President Hall and Provost for their work with the faculty
 - In addition, she thanked the Faculty Senate for working with her while she was President
- 2. University President -Tim Hall
 - Presented comments regarding President Berg's abilities as Senate President
 - Presented APSU's budget issues for upcoming year
 - Discussed the process in submitting and revising a budget

- Presented chart on the upcoming year's budget with numerical values for revenue (sources of funds) and expenditures (use of funds)
- Reported that we will experience an increase in state appropriations for the second year in row with APSU being first in these funds of the Tennessee institutions
- Announced that APSU will receive 3.8 million dollars in revenues next year with remarks that this is not typical of other institutions
- Highlighted several proposed expenditures for the upcoming year
 - Salary equity
 - o Inflationary adjustments
 - o Proposed buildings projects
 - o Investments with Inside Track to assist with advising students
 - Regularize items we have been doing for past 6 years as special projects (grants and special funding for academic areas)
 - Faculty promotions
 - o Taking on Title III costs as funding has discontinued
 - Awards of scholarship money
- Announced the upcoming celebration in recognition of the largest monetary gift to the University; totaling \$333,000 per year for scholarship endowment for total of \$10 million
- 3. Provost Tristan Denley
 - Joined President Hall in thanking President Berg for her work as Faculty Senate President
 - Indicated that academic scholarships for 26, 27, and 28 ACT scores total \$120,000.00; although these individual scholarships are modest amounts, they help in recruiting these students which increases the tendency of their tendency to attend APSU
 - Stated that the focus of spending our funds was to typically to generate more funds
 - Provost Denley wants to get the Inside Tract program off the ground in positive way
 - Reported that all indications are that programs involving Course Bundles tend to improve retention of student enrollment
 - Living Learning Communities arrange ways students can learn within an academic community
 - Planning on creating these learning communities through scheduling
 - President Hall wants to see half the freshmen enrolled in the Course Bundles
