

#### ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

- Perry Scanlan, "Numbers for 1/4/2021 reported as of 1/2/2022. Four deaths today and 1 other since last reported over the weekend. We are approaching all-time highs for 7-day averages for positive cases. There have been increases in the 7-day average cases every day since Christmas day. I project that due to the holidays and back to school for K-12 we will not see steady decreases in cases until about January 24th 2022. We are 10% over our 7-day % positive test average and now averaging over 50% of our tests done as positive in the County. What this indicates is that we are under testing, as a lower percentage would indicate we are distinguishing positive from those that are negative. Right now, we are mostly confirming the most obvious cases. This suggests the current numbers in Montgomery Co. are higher than reported."
- From Montgomery County Unified Command meeting 1/3/22: Joey Smith reports 43% of the newest + cases are Omicron variant. CMCSS has 42 students + and 744 in exclusion, and 20

employees + with 31 in exclusion. Tennova has updated the visitation policy, limited to minors or special needs patients only. 25 patients in house, but the real concern is the 30+ staff and 9 more tested yesterday. They have had 10 employees positive to 30 + in 48 hours.
