Greetings:






It is enough to say that while being feared by every team this year, the coming '51-'52 season will find each club yet more doubtful over its success.

The physical education department was instrumental in promoting this program as an adjunct to the physical well-being of the students. In this instance the students are enjoying an activity designed by the school for the students betterment.









TENNIS
