FACULTY SENATE

UNAPPROVED MINUTES OF THE MAY 13, 1982 MEETING OF THE FACULTY SENATE

1. Vice-President Sears called the meeting to order at 3:05 p.m.
2. Minutes of the April 22 meeting were approved.
3. Agenda was approved.
4. Announcements.
 - a. Salaries: The university has proposed to the SBR across the board increases of 8% for classified employees, 7% for administrators and 6½% for faculty. In addition there will be longevity pay (\$75 per year to 15 years) and merit pay.
 - b. Health insurance: Faculty contribution is expected to rise by 30-35% next year. About 5% of this increase will finance a dental plan, the benefits of which are said to be minimal.
 - c. Fort Campbell compensation: Dr. Sawrey reports that according to SBR policy, a FCC session that starts before or after the summer quarter does not qualify for the summer term's rate of compensation.
5. Faculty Senate Elections: The following were elected by acclamation:

6. Summer Meetings: Moved that the Faculty Senate not hold regular meetings during the summer. Seconded and passed.
7. Election of Faculty Sub Council Representative: Glenn Carter and Jim McMinn were nominated. Glenn Carter was elected.

8. Proposed Senate By Laws:

- a. Moved that the first sentence of III, ix, b be amended to read "Any full time faculty member may nominate any tenured faculty member except himself." Seconded and passed.
- b. Editorial changes adjusting male pronouns in II C ("he" and "his" become "(s)he" and "the") and regularizing punctuation (p. 5) were accepted.
- c. Moved that the Proposed By Laws be adopted as amended. Seconded and passed.
