She represents these topics by sculpting full figured forms as well as painting portraits of the human body. During her time in school she has had her art hung in various locations for extended periods of time. These locations include the Trahern Dance and Theater building at Austin Peay State University lobby (one school year), and the women's study's office at Austin Peay State University (2) years). She was also awarded a student Living Gallery space for the duration of spring semester. This is a live working space for teacher and students to visit and view her progress along with 9 other students through the semester. This space is awarded to ten students each semester from the many students who apply. After graduation she intends to attend graduate school for Art Therapy along with furthering her career in sculpting.

In the beginning of my 4150 I created a show around the same thesis but with a different concept idea. Of course, this idea changed a lot through the semester in 4150. I then began working on this show in the early part of the 2019 summer, however on July 4 I found out I was pregnant. Meaning that by my show date on November 4 I would no longer be able to hang or work on my projects due to weight and material restraints that come along with pregnancy. So, come the fall semester in 4160 my show did a complete 180 and was back at square one. I took the same thesis and created a final show with materials that were safe for pregnancy. This show developed a whole lot within the short period. Therefore, this book is split into my 4150 concept and my later 4160 concept.

Spring Semester 4150


4150 Thesis Proposal:

My new proposal is to consume my viewers with a room full of senses to feel what a person living with anxiety and manic depression feel on a daily basis. I want to paint the room completely red. Then within the room I want a display of four rows of mask in each row there will be five mask 10cm apart. The first face will show my normal resting face each face after that will change in some degree till the final face displays my true raw emotion that's hidden daily. These masks will be plaster cover in clear sealant to give them a shine. On the walls will hang three sculpture. One will be of me from the back with multiple hands holding me. The second will be my front being held down by multiple hands. The third is three cages with a silhouette in a fetal position, these cages will vary in size. Finally, in the background there will be a rising heartbeat playing.

For the remaining two semester I have here at Austin Peay State University I want to focus on the life changing effects that living with manic depression has on an individual. Within the last year I have been diagnosed with this mental disorder witch has changed me not only as an individual but as an artist as well I plan to conceptual portray this idea by first going through my journals and finding the main six emotions I went through the most. With these emotions I am going to choose a journal passage that express this feeling the most. I then will create a mask capturing that emotion. These six mask will all be the same material, color and size. This consistency is the same to show that the individual feeling this is always the same no matter the emotion. These mask will be displayed in the center of my show. The next conceptual part of this show is an insulation of what I call "brain wave clusters". They are abstract cluster cylinders I have started to developed. These clusters are all made of different material centered on an episode or mood shift. I have research and will further research the use of clay, slip casting and paper mashie to make these clusters. I will chose materials like candy wrappers, used condoms/condom wrappers, baby diapers, baby blankets, journal inputs, new paper add/ articles, rope or mops. These materials will then be manipulated into the clusters to be hung in a growing or consuming effect around the mask. They are all different size ranging from the size of a small table to as small as a gum ball. This will be a representation of the servility of an episode and the length of time it lasted. I feel like the use of different material and the size variation will show the drastic range and changes within this life style. My main focus of this is to portray how this diseases consumes an individual's life behind a normalcy of a mask.





These pieces will show my progression from being diagnosed with manic depression to where I am in the recovery journey today. On the walls will hang three sculpture along with an insulation piece and roughly 7 paintings. While in the background there will be a rising heartbeat playing. In the end the viewer should be able to relate and understand how I and many others feel living with manic depression.

Artist Statement:

My work thus far creates personal imagery based off my own experience with manic depression. While also luring my audience into an understanding of my daily struggles that I overcome. This show creates a conversation with in one's self and between others that we may not have had before.

With this project I began by choosing a conversation to spark a desire for more between my art and audience. When creating this conversation represented in the "Consume Me" gallery. I looked within myself and reached out to three other induvial who live with manic depression daily. Our conversation, interactions, and just every day movements change due to the internal struggle each day with depression. Some days you wake up with the ability to fully function. While other days depression will cripple your ability to walk, talk or think clearly.

Within this work I started by choosing to show from base emotions to extreme emotions through a varied display of masks. This allows the audience to see the internal struggle to the external representation. I then took personal passages and created pieces to how these passages made my body and mind feel through the experience. I wanted to connect my internal thoughts with an image my audience could interpret for themselves. Through this process I realized I was not researching the connection between actual feelings and the interpretation of feelings. This is where I chose to place the gallery in color and sound to create an atmosphere that represented my mind during a panic attack.



















































My Reflection

While in senior thesis 4150 and 4160 I not only went through many obstacles that challenged me, but I also become more aware of who I was as an artist. In the beginning of 4150 I found out that because I was a BA I didn't have to take 460 or have a senior show, however I was not okay with that. So, I approached, my advisor and professor about having a senior show and taking 4160. After a faculty vote I was granted a senior show slot. This was the fist step to completing my education the way I seen benefitable to my future.

Throughout 4150 I ran into the normal problems and artist has flushing out an idea. The options of material, time restraint, and just overall concept. However, I had gotten to a good place to begin working towards the end of the spring semester. My show still carried the same story line of Manic depression, but it was in a more general sense with out any personal input. Witch I feel after looking back would have not been as successful as my final show was.

Most of my self-reflection happened with my work and show happened in the early months of the fall semester. My biggest hurtle was becoming pregnant during this period of time. I was overjoyed but knew I had loads of work ahead of me. I quickly jumped into action. My media went from plaster and cement to clay, insulation, and paintings on paper. The concept switch foam broad to my personal and kind of a story line of who I was with manic depression. After many meetings with my mentor and many other teachers I began working on a completely different show Then the one I had originally presented in 4150.

In the end being a conversational and confrontational artist I not only choses a topic that was hard for my audience to start conversations about, but I also struggled with my own personal journey through creating my show. Through these pieces I used my own stories. This created the hardest hurdle of them all due to emotional limits with some of these topics I had to stretch out deadlines I didn't have much wiggle room on. This affected some of the other pieces quality because I no longer had as much time to work on them.

Through this experience I realized how flexible I was as artist, and just how much this program has taught me about the art profession. As well as how important it is to rely on the community of artist you have around you. Some of the relationships I have created through my education really lead to the success of this show. In the end after all the twist and turns this show changed me as much as it changed. I now understand where I want to go as an artist, the path I am on healing and how to be a successful member of the art community I end up in all after my experience in 4150 and 4160.
