# 1956 FAREWELL AND HAIL


An annual is a mystery until it is seen by the students for whom it is published. No one, not even the editor, knows just how it will be received.



The Agriculture Club is proud of its accomplishments and looks forward to even better years at Austin Peay State College.









## MEN'S HOUSE COUNCIL

A familiar hat

The 1946-47 basketball team was undefeated in college competition and placed George Fisher and James Stone on the TIAC All-Tournament team. Paul Aaron and Stone were named to the Banner All-State team and Stone placed ninth in the nation in scoring. Assisting Coach Aaron were Ed Rutledge and Lee McKinney.

1947-48 brought another good hardwood season for the Governors. They were the only team to beat Delta State on its home floor.

In 1948 Coach Aaron, aided by a former Clemson star, Leon Sandifer, installed the "T" formation. The new system paid off and the Red and White won 8 of 10 games. Golf, tennis, and other smaller sports began to appear that year for the first time since the war.

The '49 football team, with the addition of Backfield Coach Don Gary, again won 8 of 10, with the highlight of the season being a 20-6 victory over Camp Campbell.

The basketball teams during '47-'49 were also outstanding with James "Boxhead" Stone being named to the NAIB All-American team.

In 1950 L. E. Oakley was named to the Paul B. Williamson Little All-American team with Phil Krug and Julius "Rock" Sneed gaining honorable mention. Ben Fendley was named All-Conference for three years.

The 1950 basketball season saw Dickie Covington win two games on his outstanding free throw shooting.

In 1951 Kenneth Cooper of Vanderbilt fame was added to the coaching staff and is now head football coach.

After the war years, during which there were no athletics at Austin Peay, there came a new face to the campus in the person of Mr. David B. Aaron.

Coach Aaron received his training at Cumberland University in Lebanon, Tennessee. He was an outstanding football player there, being named on the "All Fifty Year" squad. In addition to the LL.B. degree which he received at Cumberland, Coach Aaron holds the B.S. and M.A. degrees from George Peabody College and was a Lieutenant Commander in the United States Navy.

Mr. Aaron was instrumental in helping form the Volunteer State Athletic Conference in 1947.

Many are the greats who have played under Coach Aaron, and we'll only have space to mention a few.

The Governors, led by Co-Captains Bill Alexander and Bobby Way, had a football season of six defeats, two wins and one tie. Although the games lost make the record look bad, the season was much more successful. The Govs lost their first three games by only one touchdown.

First on the Austin Peay agenda was East Tennessee who won a hard-fought decision over the Governors 6-0. The next week the Governors played the high-ranked Presbyterian College and suffered another loss of 13-7.


The Governors then journeyed to Florence State where they were stopped again by a score of 13 to 7. Next on the schedule was Middle Tennessee. The "Blue-Raiders" of Murfreesboro are the Governors' biggest rival and were highly favored over the Govs. But when the "Raiders" came to Clarksville, Austin Peay played a hard and determined game and managed to gain a 14 to 14 tie.

Austin Peay went to Missouri where they were defeated by a score of 20-2 and then played Murray State and lost 20 to 13. Still the Govs could not pick up enough spirit and determination and lost their seventh straight game to Tennessee Tech by a score of 37-6.

After seven defeats, something happened. The boys knew they were going to face the best team they had played all year. Spirits were high and Arkansas State came to Clarksville to make it eight losses. But the Governors began playing ball as soon as the ball was kicked and they walked away with their first win, 19 to 6.

The Governors closed the season with a 32-12 victory over the All-Stars of Fort Campbell. It was, without doubt, their best performance of the season. Quarterback Crow played his best game as he charged the line for two touchdowns. Leon Vaughn for AP was voted outstanding lineman for the game. Tackle Bobby Brown received the Sportsmanship award.

In the statistics department, Austin Peay picked up 116 firstdowns and their opponents picked up 132. Austin Peay picked up 1,505 yards rushing and the opposition picked up 1,836 yards. The Govs completed 30 passes out of 116 and had 12 intercepted for a passing yardage of 455 yards. The opponents passed 99 times and completed 40 for a net yardage of 698 yards. They had 10 passes intercepted. Austin Peay was penalized 665 yards and other teams were penalized 585 yards. The Govs punted 54 times for a total yardage of 1,747 yards. They averaged 32.4 yards per kick.

Virgil Hill, who was converted from guard to fullback, was the rushing leader for AP. He carried the ball 65 times for 315 yards. This is an average of 4.8 yards per carry. Fredy Layton had the best average for carrying the ball. He carried it 40 times for 211 yards for a 5.3 yards a carry. Al Rogers was next, picking up 260 yards in 50 tries for an average of 5.2 yards per try.

Corso averaged 4.3 yards, Crow averaged 3.7 yards, Hawkins averaged 3.1 yards, Alexander averaged 3.0 yards, Cates averaged 2.4 yards, and Smith averaged 1.7 yards.

Oscar Odum, David Thompson, Don Woods and David Wagner served greatly at the ends.

No player can be picked as outstanding for the season. All the boys worked hard together and every man did his share of the work. We especially welcome our ex-stars, Leon Vaughn and Oscar Odum, who have returned from the service and who both played excellent ball this year.

We are looking forward to a successful season next year and three new foes have been added to the schedule. They are Troy State, Memphis State and Arkansas Tech.







The Governors ended one of their best basketball seasons with 17 wins and 9 losses. They were ranked second to East Tennessee in the Volunteer State Athletic Conference. The first few games caught them just a little out of shape and they got off to a slow start. However, after a few games, they found the range of the basket and went on to beat some very good teams such as Arkansas State and Middle Tennessee. All of the starting lineup were freshmen and sophomores and they quickly caught the swing of collegiate basketball.

The Governors returned only 5 men from the '54-'55 squad. These were John Rendek, Doug Moore, Phil Brown, Bill Lax and Carl Taylor. Seven new men were added to the squad. They were Kenny Geralds, Van Washer, Chester Garrett, Morris Clark, Frank Davis, Glenn Fenneman, and L. J. Sanders.

Doug Moore, a 6-9 center, graduated at Christmas and Coach Aaron was in need of a big man to take Doug's position. Uncle Sam answered this need by sending AP the big, husky, versatile Tom Morgan. Tom played with the Governors during the '52-'53 season and is one of the best ball players that we know of. During his first year at AP Tom averaged 20 points per game as well as doing a magnificent job on rebounding.

This year Tom has played in 20 games and scored 380 points for an average of 19 points per game. He made All-VSAC and All-VSAC tourney.

Tom was assisted by little Kenny Geralds. Geralds is a sophomore and is one of the best all-round guards you can find. Geralds was voted the most valuable player in the Capitol City Invitational Tournament in Nashville and made All-VSAC.

For the entire season the Govs rolled up 2128 points as compared to their opponents' 1968 points. The Governors averaged 76 points per game and the opponents averaged 70.3 points per game.

In individual scoring Tom Morgan set a new record in


the AP Memorial Gym. He replaced Jim Cummings' 35 points with 38 points in one game.

Others helping Tom in the scoring were: Kenny Geralds with 320 points for 26 games for an average of 12.8. L. J. Sanders, a big freshman center, scored 260 points for an average of 11.3 points per game. Van Washer, a capable guard, averaged 9.2 points for 21 games. The other big man on the boards was Frank Davis who scored 223 for an average of 8.6 points. Chester Garrett, a man for tight games, scored 136 points in 21 games for an average of 6.8. Phillip Brown scored 153 points for 6.1 points. Captain John Rendek scored 99 points in 21 games for a 4.8 average.

All of the boys played good ball and showed good sportsmanship. When they were defeated, they would still smile and congratulate the winners. This is something we can boast about.

We are looking forward to next season when we are expecting our best year ever in basketball. All of our men are freshmen and sophomores except John Rendek, who is a senior. We hear rumors that some of our former stars are planning to join us again next year. We hope this is true and we will see you on the hardwood next year.

## TRACK, 1955

The 1955 track team displayed ability that all Governor supporters were proud of. They participated in four dual meets and one triangular meet. They won four of the meets and lost one to the University of the South. The Governors entered the Tennessee Intercollegiate Athletic Conference track and field meet at the University of the South, at Sewanee, and finished third behind Memphis State and the University of the South.

In the V.S.A.C. field and track meet, Austin Peay came in second, with East Tennessee winning the meet. The Governors set three new records in the meet. Al Rogers set one in the 440-yard dash as he made the distance in 53.4 seconds. The relay team composed of Chipman, Ted Smith, Virgil Hill, and Rogers set the new record for the mile relay with a time of three minutes and 39.7 seconds. Ed Kulakowski set a new record for the Govs with his shot put toss which traveled 42 feet and 5 inches.

The Govs racked up a total of  $41\frac{1}{4}$  points during the regular season as compared to their opponents  $26\frac{3}{4}$  points. They took 50 first places, 41 seconds, and 31 thirds.
