Attempts to burn the Administration Building were quelled by nearby National Guardsmen. Chief Suiter, well known cop about the campus, broke up a scheme to dynamite Waddel Hall.

Further actions motivated by Freshmen necessitated the calling of troops from Fort Campbell to maintain order.

Prior to this time, it was fel that fraternities and sororities hin dered activities more than the veleped, because of the formation ocliques, hazing, etc. The entire scope was changed in an address to the General Assembly by at lorney general Larry Hyke, forme:

Mr. Hyke pointed out that fruternal orders were necessary of the campuses of such schools a Austin Peay because they creat wholesome competition, put the school on more of a social level and give members advantage over regular students.
