


President Joe Morgan







Fully-processed color . . . largest edition ever . . . increased advertising . . . and additional features highlighted the 1963-64 editions of **The All State**, weekly campus newspaper.

The weekly, whether four or eight pages, also ran several exclusive stories which increased readership to an all-time high.

Student opinion, editorials and letters to the editor reached a high ebb as **The All State** continued to be the voice of the students.

Under the general management of Mr. Sherwin Clift, director of public information, the newspaper gained membership into two additional professional critical services—Associated Collegiate Press and the National Collegiate Press Service.




Plays On

Several projects and activities each year increase the membership and recognition of the Business Club of Austin Peay State College.





The Interlingua Club meets weekly for programs ranging from song fests to speeches by world travelers.





1963 Football

The 1963 gridiron season at Austin Peay State College saw the Governors finish with 1 win and 9 defeats. In his first year as head coach, Bill Dupes was faced with the problem of a lack of experience. The squad was loaded with freshmen and sophomores with only one senior.

Despite the way the games turned out, the Governors played impressive ball as can be seen by examining the record books. Nine records were broken or tied by the 1963 football squad.

Tim Chilcutt personally broke six Governor records. He added his name to the individual career record book as he upped his punt returns to 37, kickoff returns to 35, and kickoff return yardage to 740. He also topped his own single season marks for most punt returns, 20, and kickoff return yardage, 415. He established another record when he returned 5 punts against Fort Campbell.

Punting specialist Sammy Flatt cracked a single season record for the most punts, 54, and tied a single game record with 10 boots against Murray State.

Carlton Flatt, who along with Ed Bunio received honorable mention on the All-OVC team, tied the single season mark of three pass interceptions.

Bobby Byrd amassed an amazing total of 103 assists during the 10 game slate.

In the passing department, Carlton Flatt led the team with 39 completions in 76 attempts for a total of 579 yards.

Arnold Huskey led in rushing with 299 yards followed closely by Carlton Flatt with 296. Adding to his kickoff and punt records, Tim Chilcutt also led in pass receiving with 246 yards. Bettering his own average of 36.6 yards per punt in 1962, Sammy Flatt led the punting corps with a 37.0 average.

Although the going was tough for the Governors in their first year in the Ohio Valley Conference, things look good for the future with many lettermen returning in 1964 plus the addition of several transfers to the team.

1963-64 Basketball

George Fisher, in his second year as head coach, directed the Governors to a successful debut in the national prominent Ohio Valley Conference. Considered at the beginning of the season by many as the cellar team in the conference the "Big Red" soared to a 7-7 conference mark and a 14-9 overall record.


Miller proved to be a wise choice for captain as were alternate captains Murray and DeForest. Fisher heavily relied on veteran players; Stamper, Sledd, Bradley, Keller and Darke. Other players who capably supported the team were Ellis, Norris, Holliday, and McElfresh. Stamper, a member of the All-O.V.C. team, led the Governors in scoring with a total of 412 points for a game average of 19.6. Stamper now moves into second place in all-time scoring.

Defense proved to be one of the Governors most important assets and the team was recognized at one time as 10th in the nation in team rebounding. The leading rebounder was DeForest with a season total of 180, Miller was second with 167, and Ellis third with a total of 136.

Recognized by many as one of the best teams in the Mid-South the Governors were invited to participate in two invitational tournaments. Stamper was honored in the Quantico Tournament as the most valuable player and Murray was named to the all-tournament team at the Quincy Tournament. The Governors returned home and opened the new year on a sour note of three consecutive defeats but bounced back and showed the other teams that the Governors were capable of defeating any team in the conference.

A highlight of the season was the tremendous victory over Western Kentucky, known nationally for their winning teams. The Governors were 11 down with 2:06 remaining to be played. The Governors rallied quickly cutting the Hilltopper's lead and with two seconds left Stamper scored the most important field goal in his career as the Governors posted a 76-75 victory.

The 1963-64 season is over but the determination and effort displayed by the team will long be remembered. The Governors success primarily depended on four assets they possessed; excellent coaching, a great team effort, an abundant supply of talent, and good sportsmanship. The "Big Red" placed fourth in the OVC and Stamper was named to the all-conference team. The Governors led in players named to the all-OVC academic squad with Sledd, Darke, and Bradley receiving the high honor.





Freshmen Basketball



The cheerleaders, under the sponsorship of Mrs. John Hancoc, attended all home sporting events plus many of the out-of-town games.


For the third, the Blazing Staters have been a factor in the increased enthusiasm at athletic events with the help and support of the cheerleaders.
