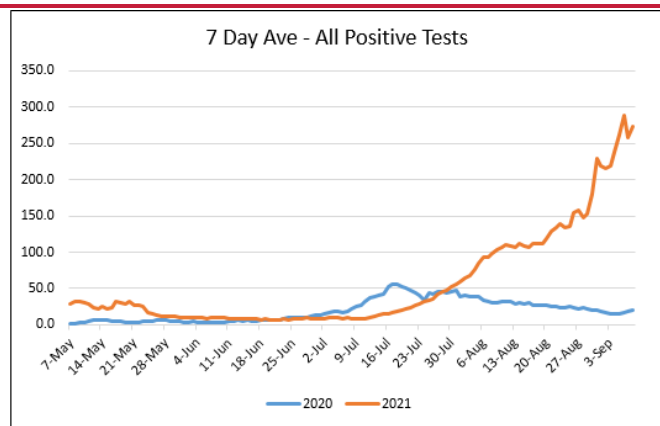

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

- The testing lab will roll out a new procedure that mirrors what Tennova and Premier are doing. Everyone will have two samples taken (in one swipe); the rapid (antigen) test will be read first. If the result is COVID positive, no further action is necessary. If the antigen result is negative, the second sample will be run through PCR testing for a reliable result. This should decrease the amount of PCR samples to be run daily, which is a 4-6 hour process per 96 swabs. Dr. Phillips has a large quantity of free antigen tests the State gave us last year. This new process could allow for potentially 50 more tests a day to be run for APSU family members (12 year old +), helping take the strain off County resources.
