





Austin Peay State University and the Tennessee Board of Regents will sponsor the Science and Mathematics Academy (SAMA), a free two-week summer program for interested area high schoolstudents, from June 6-18.



SAMA will allow high school students, who will be 10th & 11th graders in Fall 2010, to obtain an enchanced view of science and math skills, free of charge. Participants will live in an APSU residence hall take college courses, attend various events and field trips, take college entrance exams, meet faculty and make new friends. A total of 50 students will be selected to participate in this year's program.



Anyone interested should submit an application.



## History was made

In November 2009, it was announced for the first time in APSU's history, the student enrollment was above 10,000. The exact number was 10,088. "Behind every number is a

student whose dreams are being realized here," President Tim Hall said during a public announcement.

APSU had 9,296 undergraduate students and 892 graduate students, which was a 8.37 percent increase from Fall 2008. APSU is the only state university that cannot file enrollment numbers until after the 14th day of classes during the Fall II term at the Austin Peay Center @ Fort Campbell.






