

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

• Numbers for 4/21/2022 reported through 4/16/2022. County Data is showing a low number of cases in the community. The percentages of active cases and the 7-day average of positive cases is moving up even with limited reported data. There is a surge in cases nationally particularly in the Northeast United States (see last figure, per CDC) that is continuing to worsen. Metro areas that have significant population density are being increasingly affected. Until the community data is more reliable the campus COVID-19 data continues to be an early, better indicator of our environment. If trends continue we could see significant increases by the third week of May or sooner. In my professional opinion this is a very ominous sign for COVID-19 for areas like Tennessee and Montgomery County. -Dr. Scanlan
